

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held in the Village Hall, Barmby Moor

On Monday, 27 July 2015 at 7.30 pm

Present: Councillors Hill, Vass, Clark, Dexter, Haynes, Shepherd and Cllr. Mole.

Apologies: Received from Councillors Smith & Gregory.

Declaration of Interest from members on any item to be discussed: None.

Minutes: to approve the minutes of the meeting held on 18 June. Proposed to be a true record by Cllr. Shepherd, seconded by Cllr. Clark and motion carried.

Parish Council vacancy: one place still vacant. Councillors will ask locally and to advertise.

Matters Arising:

North's Fairs at the Barmby Feast – fewer rides attended as promised by Alexandra Moran. The waltzes, the dodgems, a catering van, inflatable slide and 3 children's rides. The fair closed early due to low attendance. Cllr. Shepherd proposed we have a meeting with the Feast Committee to discuss the future of the fair, seconded by Cllr. Dexter and motion carried.

Neighbourhood Development Plan – Cllr. Hill explained the procedures for preparing a plan for Barmby Moor village. This includes funds for the services of a professional services of a Surveyor. Cllr. Clark offered to obtain three quotations for this services for the next meeting. Clerk to contact Sutton on Derwent Parish Clerk for advice.

Play Park – Inspections carried out by Cllrs. Haynes and Hill on the 29 June and the 23 July. After a report from Cllr. Haynes, Malcolm McClure (Storwood Nurseries) removed the two infant cradle swings one of which was broken. Also one support from the junior swings moves when in use and the safety surfacing has been vandalised. Cllr. Dexter proposed the junior swings also be moved, seconded by Cllr. Shepherd and carried. Clerk to look into replacing and repairing the safety surfacing through Play equipment suppliers. Rospa due to carry out an inspection in September.

Defibrillator – Cllr. Hill confirmed the Boot & Slipper can be used if no other site available. The Village Hall Committee approved it can be attached to the side of the VH. Members agreed to go ahead with the installation. Once installed clerk can arrange the training for parish councillors and other villagers.

School parking and erosion of verges – letters of acknowledgement sent to the residents of Holborn Estate who sent objections to the PC at the APM. Cllr. Hill is having a meeting with the Head Teacher on Friday, 11 September.

Wildlife Area and beck – Cllr. Haynes expressed concerns from local residents about the beck and VG being very over grown. Roger Westmoreland has just cleared the beck of weeds etc. Cllr. Dexter confirmed that as a Vole lives in the beck it is a protected species and care should be taken. Jackie Jeffrey's has submitted a plan of action. Members agreed to review in October, with a suggestion of making the WL area smaller.

Annual Parish Council meeting – members agreed that the next meeting in April should only be for the public with no PC meeting afterwards. To review in October as at the moment little to discuss.

Cold Callers – clerk had contacted the Police, however East Riding of Yorkshire Council deal with licencing cold callers. Cllr. Mole agreed to approach ERYC for advice.

Pocklington & Market Weighton Community Partnership – letter of support sent to ERYC. Cllr. Mole confirmed that after full council the Community Partnership will be disbanded. Cllr. Vass concerned what will replace this committee because of the support given to Parish & Town Councils. Cllr. Mole will investigate.

Village Green registration - Planning Inspectorate visiting the site in August, Cllrs. Haynes and Hill will attend.

Parking at Sutton Lane junction – Cllr. Dexter raised concerns about vehicles parking on the A1079 junction for a swimming club. The club meets one day a week on Wednesdays during the day. He reported to Highways with no help. Cllr. Mole will try and help.

Willow trees at Beckside – Quotation from Storwood Nurseries £450 for pruning the remaining 5 willow trees and removing debris. Proposed by Cllr. Haynes, seconded by Cllr. Shepherd to go ahead with the pruning. Motion carried.

Plans: None.

Planning Approval:

Nelson Parks, Florida Keys Park Lodges, Hull Road - Unit 33 to provide managers accommodation and Unit 27 for holiday accommodation.

Green Grass Farm – letter from Lesley Scott, clerk to send a letter confirming we have objected to the plans. **Mr. J. Duffy** – emails sent to the clerk and circulated at the meeting, but no response on his address.

ERNLLCA - Hull Commission hearing in public – Press Release from University of Birmingham with findings to help economic growth in Hull & East Riding. Members agree to support economic growth in this area but they prefer the boundaries remain the same for the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Local Access Forum – members noted the report, however no one plans to attend the meetings held in Skirlaugh, Beverley, Cottingham or Hull.

Electronic working with the Planning service – Cllr. Hill attended the training course in May. Parish Councils will have to submit their observations on-line in future. No template available, so plan to use one of the old ones.

Reports from councillors after attending committee meetings:

Village Hall meeting – letter from Cllr. Gregory confirming the VH will allow the defibrillator to be attached to the VH building. Also Wi-Fi to be installed in the near future and the shed to be installed

Community Partnership – Highways meeting - Cllr. Vass attended at Shiptonthorpe VH and gave a report on the proposed dual carriageway not being ready until the end of the year; the possibility of mobile speed signs being used in all parishes; HGV's using small back roads and pot holes which need repairing.

Reports from Pocklington Provincial Councillors:

Cllr. Mole confirmed ERYC will have to save £74 million in the next 4 years.

Councillors request for items for future Agenda:

- **New litter bins requested by Mrs. Pybus** – raised by Cllr. Hill. Clerk has costs from ERYC.
- **Cycle path** – request for sweeping and cleaning the path on the B1246 after hedge and grass cutting.
