

Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on Monday, 7th September 2015

at 7.30 pm in the Village Hall, Barmby Moor

Present: Councillors Gregory, Dexter, Hill, Vass, Clark, Smith and Shepherd. Cllr. Mole ERYC Pocklington Provincial.

Apologies: Received from Cllr. Haynes.

Declaration of Interest on any item to be discussed: Cllr. Smith on payment of invoice.

Minutes: Agreed to be a true record, proposed by Cllr. Clark, seconded by Cllr. Vass and carried. Minutes signed by the Chairman.

Parish Council Vacancy: Cllr. Hill read out an email from Gareth Shephard of Boxwood House, 39 Hodsow Fields who has applied for the vacancy. Proposed by Cllr. Vass to approve by Co-option, seconded by Cllr. Shepherd and carried unanimously. Clerk will inform Electoral Services.

Clerk's Report –

Wi-Fi in the Village Hall – Open Reach keep cancelling the instalment dates. Next date to be the 10 September.

Hedge cutting at Barmby Moor School – has been carried out, but is now the school's responsibility and not ERYC.

Matters Arising:

North's Fairs – meeting with the Feast Committee on 8 September. Cllrs. Hill and Shepherd to attend. Members discussed the fair rides which were disappointing again, with some of the rides promised never turned up. Look into a new venue for the fair. Dates for 2016 (14 – 17 July).

Neighbourhood Development Plan – no response from parishioners after a request for help in the Parish Magazine. Cllr. Clark has liaised with Dick Wood (PCT Clerk), and Killian Gallagher of Geo. F. White, Shiptonthorpe for quotations and advice. Cllr. Clark pointed out we need to decide if BM will benefit from a Plan as it takes a huge commitment of time and resources. Clerk to contact a Planning Officer to attend a special meeting, with hopefully Killian Gallagher attending. BMPC will need to Precept for expenditure on Consultation and Printing, and apply for a grant by completing "an expression of interest form".

Play Park – quotations to replace two cradle swings from B & S Chains which depends on the type of seat £234.94 and £187.64 both exc. VAT. Prop. Cllr. Hill to go ahead with the more expensive seat, seconded by Cllr. Shepherd and carried. Paul Palmer (ERYC Grounds and Forestry Manager) had a meeting with the Chairman and Clerk, and has condemned the junior swings framework. Clerk to arrange removal. Cllr. Shepherd proposed we put on hold until the spring replacing the junior swings, seconded by Cllr. Vass and carried. Clerk to get pricing for new equipment ready for the November meeting.

Defibrillator Grant – defibrillator installed and training session to be held on 23 September at 1300 in the VH Back room. The Chairman signed the claim forms for reimbursement of the grant from ERYC.

Local Grant Fund – Shed installed and salt/grit deposited by Martyn Smith. Grant request form signed by the Chairman.

Cold Callers – Cllr. Mole confirmed to stop COLD CALLERS the PC need to get 100% of the villagers to agree to stopping. Members agreed to put on the Agenda for the APM. Further advice can be obtained from ERY Trading Standards.

Pocklington & Market Weighton Community Partnership – Cllr. Mole confirmed the now the Partnership has ceased, we have to deal with the necessary duties ourselves.

Village Green registration/development at Jesfield & St. Catherine's Cottage – nothing to report waiting for Planning Inspectorate to get in touch.

Relocation request to move household waste recycling site to the Industrial Estate – has been requested by Hayton & Burnby PC. Cllrs. Shepherd and Dexter confirmed the site has just been refurbished. It will cost ERYC 1.5m to relocate, money they do not have. The large vehicles using the site are the recycling vehicles, as the others belong to householders locally.

Road subsidence at Sutton Lane junction – Yorkshire Water said they would contact the clerk in August with an update of their findings. Cllr. Dexter thinks the subsidence is caused by the beck which goes under the road.

Parking at Sutton Lane junction – Cllr. Dexter reported the situation has improved, and will report back if necessary.

Litter Bins – Cllr. Hill suggested a litter bin in each lay-by on the A1079. Cllr. Dexter suggested if we can find out which company's litter is prominent at the bus stops, ask them to provide bins. Cllr. Gregory will carry out a litter check before the next meeting. Mrs. Pybus has also asked for a bin near the entrance to the Industrial Estate.

A1079 & B1246 – speed reduction on B1246 has been rejected on several occasions. Cllr. Vass confirmed the next A1079 Action Group meeting is on the 18 September. Also new cycle paths through the Industrial Estate are planned and the bus stops at Hodsow Lane/West Green have been moved near the new surgery. At a future meeting to discuss sweeping the B1246 cycle path between BM and Pocklington which is necessary after hedge trimming.

Plans:

Magnus Ltd., Eastfield, Feoffee Common Lane – this application is in Yapham Parish Council's area. No observations.

ERNLLCA Conference 2015 – at Willerby on the 23 October Cllr. Vass will see if available.

Telephone Kiosk – concerns about maintenance costs. Put on the agenda for the APM, and ask for suggestions of use in the Parish Magazine.

Safe & Sound Grant – scheme to provide home security measures for people over 60 or disabled, in receipt of benefits, a homeowner, rental or housing Association tenant. Notices on notice boards.

Green Open Home – notices on notice boards.

Reports from Councillors after attending committee meetings: None.

Reports from Pocklington Provincial Councillors: nothing to report.

Councillors requests on items for future Agenda:

Overhanging trees at Beckside near Manor Garth – Cllr. Smith has received complaints about the overhanging trees clashing with high vehicles. Clerk has chased ERYC Tree Officers to expedite the pruning, and will have a word with Miss Elmhirst.

Calley Trust – Cllr. Steven Clark has become a Trustee.

Willow Trees on the VG – are due to be pruned in October.

B1246 – Cllr. Gregory reported a cycle/pedestrian sign needs re-erecting.
