

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall,

Barmby Moor on Thursday, 24 August 2017 at 7.00 pm

Present: Councillors Vass (DV), Gregory (JG), Hill (RH in the Chair), Shephard (GS), Haynes (CM) and Strangeway (AS – Pocklington Provincial Councillor). Alan Bravey (AB), Emergency Planning Manager.

Apologies: Received from Councillors Smith, Clark and J Shepherd (JS - Resignation). Clerk to check with Councillor Dexter if he wants to remain on the PC as nearly 6 months since last attending due to ill health.

Resignation of Councillor J. Shepherd – email received as due to work commitments JS can no longer attend meetings, and cannot carry out being the Webmaster. Clerk to contact ER Electoral Services.

Minutes: To approve the minutes of the PC meeting held on the 13 July and the Planning meeting held on the 14 August. Proposed by GS to be a true record, seconded by CH and carried unanimously.

Emergency Plan: RH welcomed Alan Bravey to the meeting to discuss upgrading BM Emergency Plan.

AB explained BM was one of the first PC's to complete an Emergency Plan which was now in need of upgrading. There are three levels, **Level 1** being basic with just contact details of members, then **Level 2** with documents noting resources available, place of contact such as village halls, schools and public buildings. Also an Emergency Box and maps. **Level 3** which involves the community, what resources are available, voluntary groups and clubs, skills such as farmers and their equipment, and finally a list of vulnerable people who may need help in the event of an emergency.

ERYC Emergency Planning is the first and main contact for emergencies, AB gave details of past incidents such as flooding and tidal surges.

DV mentioned BM's Facebook page, and CH asked for advice on the Industrial Estate such as the fire last year of an aerosol factory.

AB will forward templates to the clerk, and will advise the PC when appropriate. RH thanked Alan for attending the meeting

Clerk's Report:

Gliding Club – receiving harassment from the owner of the land on Barmby Road which was refused planning for a housing development. Clerk has spoken to the GC after concerns about the cherry picker in the flight path. To give the GC Chairman RH's contact details for advice.

Ducks crossing being killed in Back Lane – members suggest the 30 mph speed limit through the village B1246 be extended a further 100 metres or more towards Pocklington. Clerk to also stress the problem of Back Lane being a rat run and short cut to the A1079. Back Lane to be added to the list of road safety concerns in the village.

Matters Arising:

Cycle path B1246 (Field Works) - David Sach ERYC has visited the site and intends to discuss the matter with Bellway. The new outfall needs further works and this will have a barrier and further regrade works in the future. However as the ditch and footway have been in place many years, without any comments or reported incidents he anticipates there will be no guard rails installed at this particular site as this would set a precedent.

No Cold Calling Zone – signs to be erected for NCZ's at Sutton Lane and Main Street. Mrs. Roberts of The Laurels requested this street be selected. Clerk to put a request in the Parish Magazine for any other areas in the parish.

Trees in Main Street –further pruning required in Main Street, clerk to meet with Lewis Trees Ltd.

Bus Shelter in Lay-by opposite Kimberley House – Proposed by RH to go ahead with ordering a shelter from ACE Shelters. Glass shelter, protection at the front – cost £2620 + VAT. Also proposed to see if a litter bin can be sited next to the new shelter. Seconded by GS and carried.

Road Safety issues A1079/Sutton Lane/B1246 and Back Lane – confirmed by AS that ERYC are not intending to resurface Main Street as originally stated by Councillor A. Burton. He has been in contact with the new Chairman of the Highways Committee with a rude response. A formal complaint has been submitted. To add Back Lane to the priority list of road safety issues in the parish.

WREN – grant application for new play equipment – waiting for approval.

Play Park name – raised by GS to give the PP a name relating to the 102 Squadron. Clerk to contact them for suggestions of a simple name. If agreed to organise a plaque on the park.

Pocklington Town Council – correspondence from PTC and the Town Mayor. RH confirmed nothing further to complain. PTC give a donation to the 102 Squadron for the re-union dinner.

Village Maintenance/Taskforce – DV suggests the PC organises a taskforce to carry out maintenance jobs in the parish. This is already being done in Dunnington and Wilberfoss. To advertise in the Parish Magazine. Clerk confirmed the PC will need extra insurance cover.

Proposal for a village logo and signs – the B & S landlord has been in touch with RH regarding a village logo. Costs of a professional signs are very expensive. GS proposed we postpone for the time being.

Boot & Slipper as a community asset – JG making enquiries with the Land Registry about this proposal.

State of footpath between BM village and SL –requested by JG. Clerk look into contacting the Community Payback or if a village taskforce is formed.

Possible weight restriction at Sutton Lane – requested by JG. Presume this is because of Cockerill's using SL. Nothing can be done regarding this as planning regulations have been checked, and this is an agricultural area.

Fly-tipping tyres on the Industrial Estate – requested by JG. Nothing can be done as they are on private land. Simon Pocklington the land owner has been made aware.

Website – need a new Webmaster due to the resignation of Jeff Shepherd. Clerk and councillors to see if they know of anyone suitable. ERYC will give training, also will have to approve costs for employing someone.

Planning approval:

Mr. S. Mohamad, Little Grange Farm, Hodsworth Lane - change of use of land to hand car wash operation including siting of storage container, welfare cabin and erection of canopy for car washing (**Ref: 17/01982**).

Grant applications

Barmby Moor Football Club – request for support for running costs. Members confused at who the flood lights belong to i.e. the Playing Field Committee or Football Club. No accounts received. CH confirmed they had been in touch with the Calley Trust for a grant.

Barmby Moor Playing Field Association – request for a replacement tractor. Accounts received therefore suggest someone comes to the next meeting to discuss costs etc.

Total amount in Bank as of 1 August - £86756.66.

Proposed by CH, seconded by MS the above invoices be approved for payment.

Correspondence:

Affordable Housing (Barmby Road) – request by David Siddle to consider affordable housing in Barmby Road. Members against development between the two settlements.

Cycle Lanes, Halifax Way – DV has been in touch with Claire Hoskins ERYC. Expect an extension to the cycle path through the Industrial Estate in 2020.

Code of Conduct training – at Pocklington on 11 October, RH to attend.

ERNLLCA – Citizenship and Civic Engagement – nothing to report.

Back Lane – email from Susan Kay expressing concerns about speeding cars in Back Lane, connect this to the list of road safety issues.

Safeguarding Adults – email from ERYC Trevor Collinson SA Board, would like to attend a PC meeting, to consider for a future meeting.

Reports from councillors after attending meetings:

Parish Council Liaison Meeting – attended by DV who gave information regarding the Police Authority. Chief Constable has been dismissed and 170m budget for 200 more police. DV could not attend the A1079 Action Group as the same meeting date.

Reports from Pocklington Provincial Councillors:

Keldspring Lane, village beck – AS has organised cleaning the beck in this lane and up to the grid of weeds and debris.

Councillors requests on items for future agenda:

Electric Car Charging points – requested by DV.

The Croft – requested by JG for TPO on copper beech trees.

Flat Lane – DV requested a speed limit reduction to 20 mph near the sports field.

Date of next meeting: 5 October, however clerk to see if the VH is available on the 28 September as RH and CH away.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting at 9.20 pm.
